Fellow Woodturner,

I've just completed a major upgrade to a tool that uses your computer to help you design segmented turnings easier and faster than any other way I know of. What do I mean by easier and faster? Well, one of my users said he recently used my tool to design a 620-piece floor vase in just over an hour. He is an experienced designer and said it normally would have taken him 8-12 hours by hand.

You can get a complete look at the Segmented Project Planner at <http://www.verifiedsoftware.com/goodturns/software.htm> where you can also see some of my projects (I'm just a beginner) as well. The program has these unique features that allow you to design both simple and very complex projects with almost equal ease:

- Segment Designs allow you to create compound segments of several material types.
- Use Named Colors to create/save color definition; use them to paint/fill any project segment simulating use of contrasting woods.
- Template Printer allows you to print cutting templates for any desired angle situation.
- Four levels of zoom let you get up close and personal with the details of your project.
- Resizes to use the whole screen so you don't have to squint to see the details.
- Calculates segment dimensions that take your personal accuracy into account so you don't have to worry about adding fudge factors.
- Calculated dimensions are displayed in fractional inches that agree with your stated cutting accuracy.
- Calculates board length to support either economy or grain matching cutting methods.
- Side view displays include wall placement in each layer.
- Displays minimum wall thickness for the project so you can avoid walls that are too thin.
- Calculates the cost of each project layer so you can see what your new project will take out of your project.

And, of course, it also has all the normal features you would expect:

- Supports frame miter, stave, and compound miter rings.
- Calculates segment-cutting dimensions for any size ring with any numbers of sides so it won't limit what you can plan.
- Calculates the size of board needed to make each ring so you don't have to buy/cut more wood than you need.
- Displays top and side views of your project so you can see what's going on at every step of your design.
- Displays overview or detail side views so you can use it to design the entire project.
- Enter dimensions in fractional or decimal inches (eg. 10 ½ or 10.5)
- A project can have as many layers as desired so you won't be limited.
- Prints full project specifics along with top & side views to a Windows printer so you can take the output straight to the shop.
- Includes context sensitive help so you can always find out what a control does.
- It ambidextrous so you can perform all tasks with either the keyboard or the mouse.
- Every menu option has a hot-key shortcut so all program actions are a single keystroke away.
- Runs on all recent versions of Microsoft Windows including 95/98/Me/XP/NT/2000.

Perhaps you would be so kind as to let your fellow woodturners know about the Segmented Project Planner.
