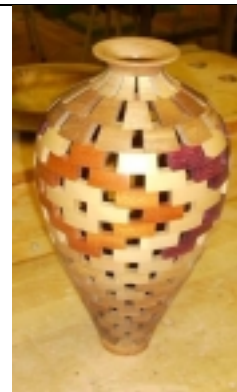

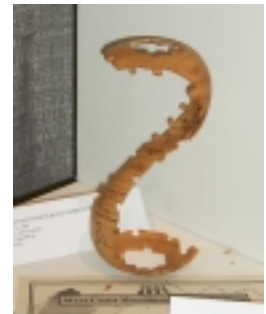

2. George Guerts deposited \$385.00 in members fees.
3. We paid Dale Nish \$200.00 for the demonstration at our October meeting. Dale gave the Guild a \$50.00 gift certificate, which we used to purchase 2 new books for the Library.
4. A motion was passed that we deduct the cost of the Hall rental from the proceeds of the Xmas Social Auction. The cost of the Hall this year is \$195.00.
5. We have invited the Fraser Valley Wood Carvers, FV Woodworkers, Richmond Wood Carvers and the Vancouver Woodturners to our Xmas Social.
6. The Kamloops Woodworkers Guild want to purchase the Dale Nish video, when it is available. The Executive agreed to allow the purchase for a cost of \$20.00, this would include shipping and handling. Margaret Eisenman will contact Dave Rawson to see if this is agreeable.
7. KMS Demo's will start in November. November 20th will be the first one, possibly on the VicMark. Next one will be December 11th.
8. Bill Olsen advised that our coffee fund is dwindling. All members must be reminded that this is not a free lunch and all extra's are paid out of the coffee fund. There is something wrong with the numbers when you collect \$25.00 and have an attendance of over 45 members.
9. If past members have not paid by our November meeting they will be dropped from the mailer and e-mailer list.
10. All donated items for the Raffle must be at the November meeting so that we can complete the paperwork to get our License. The pictures will then be taken and the tickets printed up.
11. Colin Delory advised that Cindy Drozda from Colorado will be giving a Demo Class at the Sapperton Hall in New Westminster. This is hosted by the G V Woodturners Guild at a cost of \$25.00 per person. There might be a chance that she will be our guest speaker in January/05
12. Bill Olsen suggested that we have a new product information article published in the NL. This information would come from our Friends/Sponsors, such as KMS Tools letting us know about new lathes, Windsor plywood about exotic woods, etc. It would also be good if there were pamphlets, brochures or video's available. It was also suggested that we have our Sponsors bring in some of the items and have an open discussion about them at our Guild meetings.
13. Our Hands On Turning will be cancelled for the November meeting. Colin Delory was rescheduled to November due to the Dale Nish demo surprise. I will advise in our next NL when our Hands On Turning will be rescheduled.
14. Lance Murphy advised the Executive that he was talking to Langley U-Blast in regards to Sandblasting. He will try to schedule a group outing to go to this Shop and check out what they have to offer.
