5. David Broomhead informed Colin Delory that he has paid for a renewal of our subscriptions to the Fred Holder Newsletter (\$58.00) and the Woodturning Magazine from the U.K. (\$130.00 for 3 years) He will be reimbursed these funds. Margaret Eisenman requested that we have the Newsletter and Magazine address changed to our Box Number so that they can be given to the Librarian on arrival.
6. Focus on Fundamentals. Ted Lightfoot didn't have a volunteer lined up for the October meeting, so the Executive volunteered Margaret to show how to use scrapers and parting tools.
7. Colin Delory advised us that our Website has been renewed for another 3 years.
8. We will be having a Hands-On Turning in November. If any members have Mini lathes that they can bring in for this event please advise Sam Nelson at the next meeting.
9. We are considering having a Buy/Sell or Trade of wood or woodturning tools at the beginning of our November meeting, before we start Turning.
10. We need 12 donated pieces of woodturnings for our next raffle. If anyone is interested in donating please bring the item in no later than our November meeting. In order for us to get our license we have to give a list of the raffle items to the Government. They are also requesting a letter from the 2 sponsors that we give our raffle proceeds to. Wayne Cunningham advised that these are forthcoming.
