


Woodturning Mentors


Making and Decorating Goblets

LIBRARY RULES:

The primary purpose of the library is to promote the "Art of Woodturning". The library allows members to improve their skills through knowledge and gives access to skills from artisans all over the world through video and printed word. All funds collected are used to purchase new materials for the library.

The library is for all to enjoy and your cooperation in following the few simple library rules will allow it to do just that in a fair and equitable manner:

1. Only FVWG Members in good standing (paid-up dues) may sign-out selections from the FVWG Library. When borrowing from the FVWG Library each Member also agrees to the following rules governing the borrowing and returning of the FVWG's Library holdings.
2. Books and DVD's can be borrowed at each meeting for a rental fee of \$2.00 each, payable to the Librarian at the time of signing it out.
3. Periodicals can be borrowed at each meeting for a rental fee of \$1.00 each, payable to the Librarian at the time of signing it out.
4. Borrowers must have each item verified by the librarian on the corresponding sign-out sheet along with the \$2.00 rental fee.
5. Each borrowed item must be returned at the very next FVWG meeting or event unless renewed. An item may be renewed by contacting the Librarian and having him confirm that the item in question has been renewed for one more rental period. Each selection may be renewed only one time and then it must be returned to the Library. An additional \$2.00 rental fee will be assessed for each renewed item and is payable to the Librarian upon returning the items to the Library.
6. Borrowers will be assessed a \$2.00 late fee per month for each item overdue.
7. Upon returning a borrowed item, it is the sole responsibility of the borrower to confirm their name has been removed from sign-out list. In the event an item is found to be missing, the last name on the sign-out list, if not verified, will be held responsible for full replacement cost of the lost item. Replacement payment is to be made to the Librarian.
