Are you looking for some green “Horse Chestnut” wood?

Keith Still has contacted Bill Olsen with this information about a Horse Chestnut tree he cut a few weeks ago, He has milled some of the wood with a wood miser banc saw mill to 4” and 3” thick in approximately 4’ to 7’ lengths and it is de-barked. Some is quarter sawn and some is flat sawn. Some pieces have the pith in. The wood has been end treated.

Some of the block pieces have been cut with a chainsaw. Several 100bd. ft. have not been cut up yet and some custom cutting could be done.

Keith is asking \$1.00 /bf for this material.

The wood is located south of Langley around 9th Ave and 232nd street. Keith lives in Surrey so he would have to meet you there.



